LOCAL FAVORITES

CONCERT VENUES

TJ's Corral

Named in honor of Theodore James "T.J." Day, a prominent and successful Nevada businessman, community philanthropist, ranch operator and locomotive and aviation enthusiast who passed away in January of 2014. Carson Valley Inn owner Mike Pegram was a long-time friend of T.J.'s and admired the positive affects he had on education and many worthy causes in northern Nevada. After the loss of his friend, Mike decided to rename the new outdoor venue as a small tribute to a very important Nevadan.

Cargo Concert Hall

Cargo at Whitney Peak is the perfect place for the ultimate Reno live music experience. You are always in for a royal treat at Cargo. Their lineup typically includes an eclectic mix of up-and-coming artists as well as well-known favorites.

OUTDOOR RECREATION

Kings Canyon Waterfall

Just a short 5 minute drive west of downtown Carson City on King St. which deadends at the Kings Canyon Trail-head. This 25-foot cascading waterfall is most full in the Spring time but still is a beautiful sight in all seasons.

Washoe County Golf Course

In Reno, we are lucky enough to be home to the state's oldest links — the Washoe County Golf Course, which was established in 1934. This classic Reno golf course offers something for everyone from beginners to the most experienced golfers.

Bently Heritage Trailhead

Explore nearly 5 miles of hiking trail adjacent to the Carson River in the Carson Valley. Here, the Carson River winds its way in braided channels, supporting willows and wetlands that sustain many animals and migratory birds. The trail provides visitors with access to these natural areas and to amazing panoramic views.

Dayton State Park

At the foot of the Virginia Range, on the banks of the Carson River, Dayton State Park is rich in picturesque beauty as well as gold and silver mining history. The park features the remains of the Rock Point Mill built in 1861, a remnant of Dayton's mining glory days. Old stone walls from the mill, one of the first to process ore from the Comstock Lode, still stand among cottonwood, sagebrush and willows.

The Basil






RENO: BIGGEST LITTLE CITY
